- 3. learn various evidence-based strategies for supporting 2E students



Introduction

Gifted students are typically known as students who have exceptional cognitive and learning abilities. However, gifted students may also have a special need or disability – just as students with disabilities may also be gifted, and these are referred to as twice-exceptional (2E) students. Identifying this population of gifted students is usually problematic because their gifted abilities and difficulties may mask each other. Therefore, this seminar aims to address the academic and socio-emotional needs of these 2E students and provide evidence-based strategies for support.

This seminar will explore the distinguishing strengths and complex challenges that these 2E students may face, from an overview of twice-exceptionality and unique patterns of these students to strategies, instructional classroom management strategies. strategies in response to emotional/behavioural problems, long-term suggestions for comprehensive programming, and strategies for identification. This seminar will also discuss the application of the SWAM model, using a strength-based approach with the weakness compensatory strategies to accommodate the needs of this special in learning, instruction, and behavioural/emotional population regulation.
