

## Important Notice

1. The Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education (HKAGE) provides services exclusively to student members aged 10 to 18 currently studying in schools in Hong Kong. Therefore, students must be born between 1 July 2006 to 30 September 2014 to be eligible for applying for the "Screening Programme".
2. Each school can assist up to 50 students per year in applying for the "Screening Programme". Each student can only enrol in ONE "Screening Programme".
3. Each secondary school can nominate one gifted student in leadership from Secondary 2 to Secondary 4 to the HKAGE through the "Principal's Nomination" channel. Nominated students, exempt from the Screening Programme, will be invited to submit their personal profiles for assessment directly.
4. Students who successfully pass all screenings will only become HKAGE student members by June every year as Secondary 6 (or equivalent to the final year of secondary school) students will be graduating. Therefore, applications for the "Screening Programme" from these students will not be accepted.
5. All applications must be completed between **25 September 2023 (9:00 a.m.) to 12 October 2023 (12:00 noon)** through the "School Account". The HKAGE will not process any applications or changes to the enrolled programmes after the application deadline.
6. School Coordinators should ensure **accurate and valid email addresses** of the students' parents are provided for correspondence. School Coordinators should remind students and parents to contact HKAGE via email at [sss@hkage.org.hk](mailto:sss@hkage.org.hk) if they do not receive the application result and login details after the start of the "Screening Programme".
7. Each student can apply for ONE "Screening Programme" only and multiple applications for the same student in the same school year are not permitted. Students who enrol in the "Screening Programme" via "School Application" cannot enrol in another "Screening Programme" via "Parent Application". The HKAGE will only consider the "School Application". If students wish to change the application channel, they must withdraw from the original application and reapply.
8. Schools can gather more student information through various channels (e.g. academic results, competition results and other recommendations) using the Education Bureau's Talent Databank module in the WebSAMS to help identify suitable students.
9. Schools can access the information about their students who apply via "School Application" or "Parent Application" including applications and results for the "Screening Programme", progress on submission of students' personal profiles and nomination results.
10. The Screening Programmes are self-learning programmes with no fixed timetable. Students need to study the programme and complete the final assessment within the designated period.
11. The quizzes/questions within the module of the "Screening Programme" are for students' self-assessment of their learning progress. Only the Final Assessment contributes to students' performance in the "Screening Programme". The time limit for the final assessment is 60 minutes. Students must pass the Final Assessment to complete the "Screening Programme".
12. Students can attempt the final assessment a maximum of two times within the study period of the "Screening Programme". Only the higher score will be considered. The questions for the second attempt (if taken) may differ from the first one.
13. Current HKAGE student members are not eligible to apply for the "Screening Programme".
